- Contact between professionals and avocationalists; keeping the public passionate



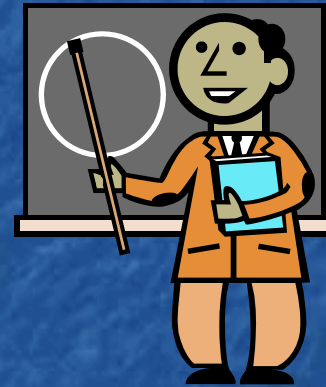
Avocational Opinion
